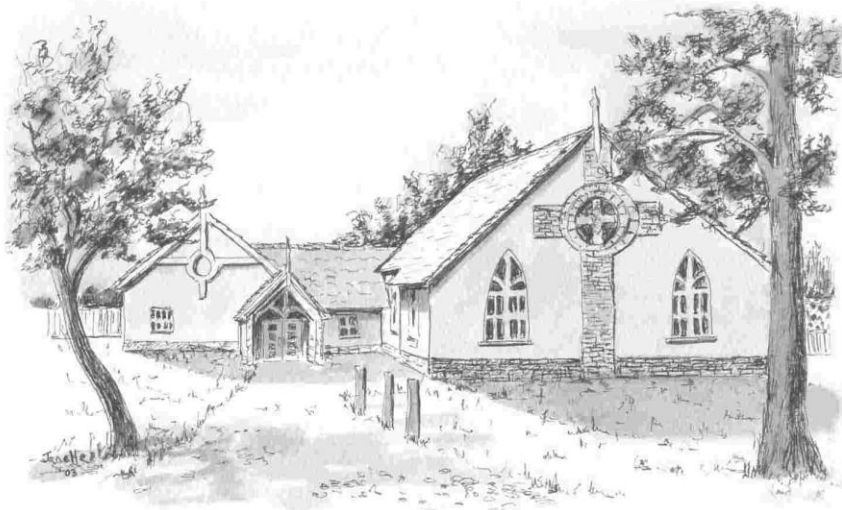

## The Parish of Sonning

The ancient parish of Sonning, originally extending from Sonning Common to Sandhurst was one of the great blocks of land handed over to the Church in the 7th century. In 909 A.D. Sonning with Ramsbury, became a separate bishopric, the Bishop of Ramsbury/ Sonning maintaining a riverside Hall in the village. In 1075 the see was transferred to Old Sarum, ultimately Salisbury, whose bishops had their own Palace on the same site as the Saxon Hall until 1574, when the manor was transferred to the Crown.

St Andrew's Church in the heart of the village was founded in Saxon times - probably by Birinus, first bishop of Dorchester-on-Thames. It was largely rebuilt in 1852, during the incumbency of Canon Hugh Pearson; it was he who founded the Sonning Parish Magazine in 1869.

The White Hart Hotel, now known as The Great House, and partly 17th century, stands on the site of older buildings including the home of 'Elias the Ferryman' mentioned in a deed of 1100. The French Horn Hotel, in Sonning Eye, was built in the 1880s in front of the original old inn - now Bridge House - and its farm buildings. The Bull Inn, belonging to the Church, was originally known as Church House, a guesthouse for pilgrims to medieval St Sarik's Chapel in St Andrew's. Also adjoining the church is Deanery Garden one of Sir Edwin Lutyen's best-known country houses built at the turn of the century, just above the site of the ancient residence of the Deans of Salisbury who regularly visited Sonning, the parish being a 'Dean's Peculiar'.

Sonning Mill produced a regular supply of flour from Saxon time until 1969, after which it was converted into a 'Dinner Theatre', the first of its kind in Britain. The Pearson Hall is the principal venue for village functions

Within the village boundaries lie the Reading Blue Coat School at Holme Park (once the home of the Lord of the Manor) Sonning Church of England Primary School, King George's Field and other sports grounds, and Reading University Farm - all of which help to preserve the rural atmosphere of Sonning, the centre of which is now a conservation area.

The civil parish of Charvil is of relatively recent origin but the land on which it lies has long been part of the ecclesiastical parish of Sonning. In the 18th and 19th centuries it consisted of Charville Farm and a few cottages, which lay between the villages of Sonning and Twyford and adjacent to the London to Bath highway.

The development of Charvil began between the two World Wars, particularly after the new A4 road was constructed in the 1920s bypassing Twyford, and was accelerated after 1945. To meet the needs of this increasingly large community, St Patrick's dual-purpose Church and Hall was consecrated and opened in 1952; it remains within the ecclesiastical parish of Sonning. It was considerably extended and refurbished in 2001.

**The Vicar's Letter**

Dear friends,

Since its opening in 2004 I have managed to avoid the memorial fountain to Diana, Princess of Wales in Hyde Park; that is until last week. We had taken Alice and Annabelle for their first visit to London, and, whilst strolling through the park, came upon it. It was an underwhelming experience, and I was left with the nagging question, why? Whatever one's thoughts about the late Princess, if a memorial was deemed necessary, why a grey granite circular trough of gurgling water?

Of course, not far from there is another memorial of sorts, to a departed member of the Royal family, the Albert Hall. It has stood the test of time, and quite apart from being a fine piece of architecture, continues to be of valuable service to the city, and nation. The Victorians were prolific memorial builders, and, as we see in Sonning, were very keen on erecting buildings and structures to commemorate people of note. The Pearson Hall is a good example, and serves as a fitting monument to one of my esteemed predecessors. The fine lychgate at the top of the church yard was paid for

by public subscription to celebrate the diamond jubilee of Queen Victoria, and there are of course other examples.

I suspect the Diana fountain, along with some other contemporary memorials and celebratory commissions won't be as successful in standing the test of time. However, that shouldn't detract from the importance of commemorating significant events and people, in a way that speaks to future generations.

In 2012 this nation and the Commonwealth will be celebrating the diamond jubilee of Her Majesty the Queen. This will be only the third time in our history that such a celebration has occurred, and it is to be hoped that everyone will come together to mark it. I have been giving thought as to what we might do in Sonning, and have convened a group to think about how we might celebrate during the national weekend, and also about the possibility of a permanent monument/building or whatever. The churchwardens and I are very keen that St. Andrew's should play its part in this, and I would welcome suggestions and comments. If we were able to provide something for the village that could be of service to everyone, for generations to come, I would be well pleased.

Finally, on the cliff top between Dover and Folkestone stands the national memorial to those who fought in the Battle of Britain. In my opinion it has an evocative design that will last, and it makes for a moving, if rather windy visit. This month marks the 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the air battle that arguably saved Britain from invasion in 1940, and we shall be marking this at St. Andrew's on Battle of Britain Sunday on September 19<sup>th</sup> at 10:30am. A wreath will be laid, and the service will be dedicated to 'the few', to whom we owe so much. I warmly invite you to join us.

## A Charvil View of Taizé

Three times a year we have at St Andrew's an evening reflective and meditative service based on the worship tradition of Taizé. From time to time people ask me about the origins and spirituality of Taizé. I personally have always had the highest regard for all that the Taizeé community has achieved over the years but I have never yet had the good fortune to make my own pilgrimage there. I have however been influenced by the spiritual ripples emanating from there which have spread far and wide through the many young people of all nationalities and cultures inspired by the Taizé experience of prayer, worship and activity.

The Taizé community was founded by Roger Schultz who in August 2005, during an evening service, was shot by a deranged member of the congregation and died. This year is the 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the founding of the Taizé community in the dark days of 1940 as a centre dedicated to building peace and reconciliation in a world torn apart by hate and destruction. Roger Schultz and the small band of brothers at the time and ever since witnessed to alternative visions of life based on prayerful communion with God in Christ. His vision is as relevant now in our world as it was then. His witness takes us back to the very roots of God's purpose for creation and humanity that as Jesus prayed that all his disciples might be united just as He and His father God are one.

Having just returned from a week's holiday in the rural centre of France we couldn't but help feeling that the pace of life, and the spaciousness of the countryside speak of humankind with the created order which our Father God intends for everyone. It was a spiritual renewing experience with which one could not help best identify. It is the spirit of simplicity and wholeness, impregnated with the love of God, that the Taizé community captures the hearts of the young people who invoke the pilgrimage and which should not only influence the young but all people of whatever generation who look for the meaning of life.

It has been a very busy year for us with high numbers of children attending the pre-school and plenty of activities going on. Thank you to all those who came to support us at this year's Charvil Fete - we had our best year yet in

terms of monies raised. We also had a team of Mums from the pre-school who ran the Woodley 10K run and raised over £1,300 for us - a fantastic result! All these monies will go towards enhancing the learning environment for the children.

We are now looking forward to the new term and welcoming some new children to the pre-school. We will continue with the development of our outside area and encourage lots of outside play before the autumnal and winter weather arrives. We are also planning on looking at the changing seasons as we move into autumn, setting up different role play areas to stimulate the children's play and learning and of course getting ready for Christmas and our wonderful nativity play at the end of term.

If you are new to the area or just at the stage where you're thinking about pre-school and you don't know about us, let me tell you a bit about it. The pre-school provides a safe, friendly and stimulating environment for children approaching 3 up to school age. The focus of the pre-school, which is OFSTED registered, is to give children the opportunity to learn through play by offering a variety of activities, ranging from painting and sticking to structured group work. The staff, all of whom have experience of working with children and are CRB checked, provide a fantastic learning environment for the children, encouraging them to develop their social skills, whilst having lots of fun.
